TECH SAFETY: A PANEL AND GROUP DISCUSSION

Men's Ministry, at their April 6, 2019 breakfast, had a presentation and discussion of ideas on technology and internet safety—as it relates to individuals and families. This is an important topic. It is not a matter of *if* you use technology but *how* you use it. Used rightly, tech can be a helpful servant. Used wrongly (or even carelessly), it can be a cruel and enslaving task-master.

Maintaining mental and spiritual purity while surrounded by the temptations of technology thrusts us into a new level of satanic warfare . . . Satan doesn't respond to sweet reason, he doesn't play by the rules, and he won't go down without a fight. Churches need to help, guide, and encourage their people to confront the enemy. There is nowhere to hide. This is not a war that cannot be won without prayer, earnest prayer, and intercessory prayer. And accountability." - Erwin Lutzer

The sharing of truth and the setting of rules—without a loving, intimate, and communicative relationship—will lead to a rejection of that truth and those rules by our children.
